Lines of Inquiry

These inquiries are the phases of learning that take place, supporting the children to develop their understanding of the central idea.

1. The ways of life of past civilisations (form)
2. The impact of migration on Britain (change and perspective)

Measure in km and m & equivalent lengths, perimeter of rectilinear shapes and polygons.
